**MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS**

This Bill would amend the Anti-Corruption Law (2018 Revision) in order to provide that the investigating officers of the Anti-Corruption Commission may use protective equipment. "Protective equipment" which is defined in clause 2 would be approved for use by investigating officers by the chairman of the Anti-Corruption Commission after the chairman receives the approval of the Governor.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Anti-Corruption (Amendment) Law, 2018. Short title
  
2. The Anti-Corruption Law (2018 Revision) is amended in section 2 by inserting the following definitions in their appropriate alphabetical sequence - Amendment of section 2 of the Anti-Corruption Law (2018 Revision) - interpretation
  - “body armour” means a garment or item designed, intended or adapted for the purpose of protecting the body from an item or object used to, or adapted to, stab, pierce, puncture or otherwise wound the body; and
  - “protective equipment” includes batons, handcuffs and other means of restraints, body armour, tasers and pepper spray.”.
