Rationale	Continued uptake of local vaccination and low COVID-19 prevalence rates in key Cayman Islands travel markets allow for the introduction of reduced quarantine periods and easing of other travel restrictions.	GPS monitoring is no longer required for securely verified vaccinated travellers. This allows the Cayman Islands Government (CIG) to assess local impacts and build capacity to manage the increase in traveller volume anticipated with the opening of the borders in Phase 3.	Subject to the achievement of an 80% local vaccination rate, the limited introduction of tourism during slow season with some restrictions (including a flight slot management system) allows the Cayman Islands Government (CIG) to limit the number of persons arriving. This also allows CIG and the industry to develop capacity for dealing with larger volumes of travellers in preparation for high season.	Quarantine requirements will be removed for all securely verified vaccinated travellers. It is anticipated that the local vaccination rate will be adequate, allowing for the safe increase in tourism and further relaxation of restrictions.
