The Chief Project Manager (Subsea Cable) will be directly accountable for all stages from inception to delivery of the Submarine Cable project which contains a number of programmes of work, such as the subsea cable programme initiation, detailed system feasibility/design, procurement and the build and prepare. The subsea cable is a major build of critical national infrastructure. This project requires intricate knowledge of the submarine cable sector as it involves the marine construction and landing of a new fibre optic cable for international connectivity forming part of the Cayman Islands Government's digital infrastructure strategic deliverable.

Principal responsibilities will include, but will not be limited to:

- Manage the portfolio of projects through the project management life-cycle from inception to project closure, in accordance with established best practice standards.
- Produce and maintain programme management deliverables, such as the project mandate, project initiation document, project definition document, project plan, status reports and project registers, such as the change management, risk, issues and benefits registers.
- Manage the relationship with cable ship, Network Operation Centre telecoms and other cable landing stations.
 Understanding of terrestrial fibre-optic networks and its connectivity for backhaul and local loops.
- Lead on the programme scoping and budgeting to ensure that project finances are managed in line with the agreed budget and actively drive all phases of the project life cycle and proactively manage and mitigate risks.
- Undertake procurement process to facilitate the timely delivery of assigned projects based on established Cayman Islands Procurement Regulations. Thereafter to manage the suppliers to ensure that they deliver in accordance with their contractual obligations.

A Master's degree in Cable, Fibre Optic, Telecommunications, Marine or relevant Engineering subject such as Project/ Programme/ Change Management or Business Administration. A minimum of 15 years of professional work experience with at least 10 years working for a Telecommunications Operator in a senior management position with delivery and budgetary accountability. Holds a Chartered Engineer (CEng) or similarly internationally recognized certification.
