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1. Introduction & Objectives

- 1.1. The Internal Audit Service (IAS) conducted a content and security review of the Customs & Border Control public facing website, www.cbc.gov.ky. This was undertaken during 2020 Q2 and Q3 as part of the agreed 2020 Internal Audit Plan.
- 1.2. The engagement objectives, agreed with the CBC Director in May 2020, were to provide independent assurance that:
 - There are no identifiable technical vulnerabilities on the website;
 - The ability to make changes to the website is appropriately controlled;
 - The site can be restored in the event of a malicious breach or hardware failure; and
 - The content on the website is current and functional as intended.

2. Audit Scope / Limitations on Work Undertaken

- 2.1. The audit scope was limited to the www.cbc.gov.ky website.
- 2.2. There were no limitations encountered during the course of the audit that impacted our ability to meet the agreed objectives.

3. Audit Methodology

- 3.1. The following steps were taken in order achieve the stated objectives:
 - Discussion with relevant personnel and stakeholders;
 - Review of the web-hosting contract;
 - Review of content and general functionality of the website; and
 - Testing for technical vulnerabilities.

4. Audit Conclusion

4.1. Based on the work undertaken and the evidence reviewed, the IAS concludes:

Are there any identifiable technical vulnerabilities?

4.2. Our overall conclusion is made to help inform management action. In addition, we have made 2 recommendations designed to protect or enhance government operations. Management have accepted these with the expected implementation dates shown, and subject to any comments made, in the subsequent recommendations section of this report.

5. Recommendations & Management Responses / Action Plan

- 5.1. Recommendations are made with the intent to protect or enhance government operations. They are categorized as either high or standard priority. A recommendation is considered to be high priority if not implementing it is likely to result in any of the following:
 - Substantial losses to the entity;
 - Serious failure to comply with legal or regulatory requirements;
 - · Serious reputational damage to the entity;
 - Inaccurate management information for important decision making purposes; or
 - A material impact on financial reporting.
