



TOTAL RECORDED CRIME


The crime figures in these tables do not include Covid-19 offences. Over the course of 2020 and 2021 Covid-19 restrictions had an impact on overall levels of crime and volumes were much lower than would have been anticipated in the future projections completed in 2019.

Total recorded crime (TRC) in 2023 remains 4% lower than in 2019 (pre-Covid), however it is important to note that over the past 3 years TRC has increased consistently year on year.

The 5-year trend line for TRC shows overall volumes of crime remain relatively stable



ACQUISITIVE CRIME





Acquisitive Crime (Robbery, Burglary, Criminal Trespass and Theft) in 2023 is 19% higher than in 2019. Recorded volumes of Acquisitive Crime have increased year on year since 2020. These increases are primarily driven by greater volumes of Theft offences – personal, shops/stalls and from motor vehicles.

The 5-year trend line for Acquisitive Crime shows a general increase since 2019.



BURGLARY OFFENCES





Burglary offences in 2023 are 30% lower than in 2019. Over the last 2 years levels of Burglary have increased but it should be highlighted that current volumes remain substantially lower than was experienced in the years prior to Covid.

The 5-year trend line for Burglary offences shows a general decrease since 2019.



ROBBERY OFFENCES





Robbery offences in 2023 are 84% higher than in 2019. These increases are primarily driven by spikes in offending at the end of 2022 and at points during the second half of 2023.

The 5-year trend line for Robbery offences shows a general increase since 2019.



VIOLENCE





Total violent crime in 2023 is 21% lower than in 2019. Between 2020 and 2022 there were consistent year on year reductions. In 2023 violent crime was at approximately the same level as 2022.

The 5-year trend line for violent crime shows a general decrease since 2019.



SERIOUS VIOLENCE





Offences of serious violence (Murder, Attempt Murder, GBH and Wounding) in 2023 are 21% lower than in 2019. After increases in 2021 and 2022, the volumes of serious violence reduced substantially in 2023.

The 5-year trend line for serious violence has remained relatively stable since 2019.



SEXUAL OFFENCES

Year on Year % Change		-21.2%	8.5%	-10.1%	11.3%

Sexual offences recorded in 2023 were 14% lower than in 2019. Over the last 5 years volumes have fluctuated, with an 11% increase in 2023 compared to the previous year.

The 5-year trend line for sexual offences has shown a general decrease since 2019.
